General Information

Focus

The 2009 summer school will offer three types of classes. First, a limited number of enrichment classes will be offered. These classes either prepare students for high school work or allow them to take required high school classes. Second, students with incomplete grades may be able to prevent receiving a failing grade with some focused curricular work. Counselors will contact students who can take these classes. Third, most summer school offerings are focused on providing remediation and credit recovery for students who could improve upon their regular year experiences.

Location

Summer Enrichment course will be held at both LCHS and ACHS. All other 2009 summer school classes will be held at Antioch Community High School.

Driver Education

Driver education programs will operate from Antioch High School. The dates for driver education are June 8th- July 24th. Please contact your school's guidance office for information.

Registration

To register for summer school classes, submit the course selection and registration forms along with payment to either high school's guidance office. Registration must be received no later than Friday, June 5, 2009.

Class Limits/Cancellations

Class registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. Early enrollment is important since time slots and openings are limited. Community High School District 117 students have first priority for enrollment purposes.

Summer School Calendar

Registration deadline: Friday, June 5, 2009

First day of classes – Session 1 and LRM and Health classes: June 9; Summer Enrichment: July 20th.

Last day of classes – Flexible- depending on course completion. Last date for online courses: July 20th; Enrichment classes: August 7; (*Note: Summer Enrichment course runs July 20th-August 7th from 7:45am-12:30pm*)

Tuition and Fees

All make-up and enrichment courses are \$220 (per 1/2 credit) except where noted. Full payment of tuition/fees is required at registration. If a student is eligible to change an incomplete/failure from second semester, the cost is \$50/week.

Refunds

No refunds will be made after June 5, 2009. Refunds will be issued only if the class is cancelled due to extenuating circumstances as determined by the principal.

Meeting Times

Remedial classes run from 7:30 A.M. and conclude at 3:30 P.M. There are four separate time slots for students to select. The sessions are as follows: 7:30- 9:30, 9:30-11:30, 11:30-1:30 pm., and 1:30-3:30 pm.

Attendance/Tardy Policy

Summer school is a voluntary program, but students are required to attend all classes. **Daily attendance is critical to a student's ability to be successful in summer school.** If a student is ill, the parent/guardian should contact the attendance secretary at 847-838-7621 before 7:30 A.M. the day of the absence. Students must obtain an admit slip from the office if they are tardy. Repeated tardiness will be cause for dismissal from class without credit or refund.

NOTE: A limited amount of time is available to cover the required material in each course. Therefore, daily attendance is extremely important. As a rule, students will be dropped after two absences. Please plan vacations and camps accordingly. Exceptions should be appealed to the principal.

Bus Transportation

Bus transportation will **NOT BE** available for summer school. Students will be allowed to drive to school. We will also have designed drop-off and pick-up areas. **THERE WILL BE TRANSPORTATION AVAILABLE FOR THE SUMMER ENRICHMENT PROGRAM JULY 20th-AUG. 7th.**

Student Transportation

Students who are licensed drivers may drive to summer school. Cars driven to campus should not be moved or entered until the students leave the campus at the end of their school day. **Students must park in the student parking lot south of the building. Violators will be ticketed or towed at the expense of the owner.** All vehicles parked on school grounds may be subject to search if the school administration suspects a violation of school rules. Students must register their vehicles with the main office on the first day of school.

Closed Campus

Antioch Community High School is a closed campus school. Students must remain in the building until their last classes are completed. Students who leave campus during a session or during break will be considered unexcused and could be dropped from the course with a loss of fees and credit.

Student Discipline

Rules and regulations of the regular school year are in effect according to District 117 policies. Students removed from class for disruptive or inappropriate behavior may be dropped from the school program with a loss of fees and credit.

Summer School Course Guide

Summer school courses are covered under two categories, enrichment/elective courses and make-up courses. Students will decide, with the help of their guidance counselors, what course(s) best suit their needs.

Enrichment/Elective Courses

Enrichment/elective courses are designed for students to enhance their skills in reading, English, and math as well as to augment a complete educational program.

Summer Enrichment (JULY 20- AUGUST 7))

Enrichment 9, 1/2 credit

This course, formerly known as Title I, gives **incoming freshmen** a chance to become familiar with the high school environment and earn one-half elective credit. This specific enrichment program is **at no cost to the student** and is **offered to students by invitation only**. The program will focus on increasing skills in the areas of reading, writing, communication and mathematics. The program begins at 7:45 A.M. and ends at 12:30 P.M. from July 20-August 7th.

Life Resource Management (June 9 – July 1) 7:45 am-12:30 pm

Elective 10-12, 1 semester, 1/2 credit This course fulfills the State of Illinois Consumer Education graduation requirement. This course includes classroom and laboratory experiences that develop goal-setting and decision-making skills in the areas of consumer economics, basic financial literacy, career planning, and household management. (1/2 credit – \$220)

Health (June 9 – July 1) 7:45 am-12:30 pm *Required 9, 1 semester, 1/2 credit*

Health education is a wellness-based class, which offers students an opportunity to develop life-long, healthy habits. Students will use problem-solving and critical thinking skills as they learn factual information to help them develop health behaviors. Topics include wellness, communicable and non-communicable diseases; medicines; digestion and nutrition; drug, alcohol, and tobacco issues; reproductive systems, and abstinence education. (1/2 credit – \$220)

Geometry Bridge Class- Cost: \$150 June 9-June 25 (no Fridays), 7:45-10:45 am

This course is for incoming freshmen who meet the following criteria: NWEA math scores of 240-260 and/or EXPLORE math scores of 19-21. The purpose of the course is to increase students' Algebra 1 foundation and

allow students to enroll in Geometry Honors their freshman year. This is a non credit course.

Make-Up Courses

*Make-up courses are designed for students to replace credits or courses failed during the regular school year. The cost of these classes is \$220 per 1/2 credit. For a complete course description, please refer to the Course Guide that is available in the guidance office of each high school or online. We will be utilizing an online credit recovery program to ensure students are able to make up specific credit(s). Individual plans may be established to focus on particular student needs. These courses will run from June 9th – July 20th. Students may be able to complete their coursework before July 20th, but courses will last 60 hours. **Grades will be pass/fail for make-up courses.***

Make-Up 9, semester 1 or 2, 1/2 credit

Physical Science

Make-Up 9-12, semester 1 or 2, 1/2 credit

Make-Up 9-12, semester 1 or 2, 1/2 credit

Algebra IB

Make-Up 9-12, semester 1 or 2, 1/2 credit

Algebra I, Geometry

Make-Up 9-12, semester 1, 1/2 credit

Health

Make-Up 9-12, 1/2 credit

US History

Make-Up 9-12, semester 1 or 2, 1/2 credit

Government

Make-Up 12, 1/2 credit

PE (Fitness)

Make-Up 9-12, semester 1, 1/2 credit

This opportunity will involve class instruction from 7:30-9:30 only and will include both inside and outside components with an emphasis on individual fitness.

OTHER COURSES- There are additional opportunities to make up other courses. These schedules will be determined by a student's counselor and the Director of Guidance.
